Essential Questions Portfolio Project

(Communication; Creative & Critical Thinking - Major Assignment)

Purpose: Your term project in Creative Writing requires you to demonstrate an exploration of different texts to deepen your understanding of *complex ideas about identity, others and the world.* You will demonstrate this through a *Portfolio.* A portfolio is a series of items that is organized around an idea/theme. To help you focus on an idea/theme that addresses a complex idea, you will select an *essential question* to explore (just like we did in the classroom).

Essential Question: An essential question involves asking an important question that recurs throughout one's life. Such questions are broad in scope and timeless by nature. Essential questions "are not answerable with finality in a brief sentence. Their aim is to stimulate thought, to provoke inquiry, and to spark more questions — including thoughtful questions — not just pat answers" (Wiggins & McTighe, 2005, p.106).

Portfolio: Once you have selected an essential question you will create 3 items that represent and respond to the essential question you are asking. Each item must be in a different style/presentation.

Portfolio items can include, but aren't limited to:

- Short Story (1000-1500 words)
- Drawings/Paintings/Collages (coloured with appropriate artist statements explaining the images/symbolism)
- Drama Script
- Journal Entries (minimum 3; with a total of 1000-1500 words)
- 3D Models
- Poetry Anthology (minimum 10; or 6 with included personal imagery/photography)
- Information Brochure
- Non-fiction article (1000-1500 words)
- Music Compositions (including an artist statement that explains what the different elements represent)
- Mini Documentary
- Performance
- Anything else you can come up with just run it by me!

Assessment

You will receive marks in two ways: conferencing and presentations.

Conferencing: You will have weekly conferences with me to ensure that you are making progress, ask questions, and receive feedback. During the conferences you will be asked to self-evaluate your progress, use of class time/time management, and personal growth and learning.

Presentations: You will present each of your portfolio items to me, throughout the term, on the due dates provided below. The presentation will be one on one, where I will be able to ask you questions, and you will be able to explain why you chose to present your assignment the way you did. You will also need to explain how you answered your essential question within that assignment.

Due Dates:

You will have completed and presented <u>one (1)</u>of the Portfolio items in Final Copy by <u>December 18th</u>. Students will be given their presentation dates by random draw.

Your final **two (2)** Portfolio items will be completed and presented by *January* 17. Students will be given their presentation dates by random draw.
